NELAC is a voluntary association of State and Federal Agencies formed to establish and promote mutually acceptable performance standards for the inspection and operation of environmental laboratories. NELAC is a cooperative effort of the USEPA, State and other Federal agencies. Private sector input to the process is obtained through a variety of mechanisms including open semi-annual meetings, committee participation, and the Environmental Laboratory Advisory Board (ELAB), a federally chartered committee that receives advice from a balanced representation of the private sector.



The National Environmental Laboratory Accreditation Program (NELAP) is the program that implements the NELAC standards. States and Federal agencies serve as Accrediting Authorities with coordination facilitated by EPA to assure uniformity.
